

- 2016 IRWM Plan Standards contains guidance on how to include projects
- OWOW Program has done this before, has learned lessons, now must gear up to do it again


WHY HAVE YOUR PROJECT IN OWOW PLAN UPDATE 2018?

ROLES OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE

- Setting the policies for the OWOW Plan Update 2018 call for projects to be included in the plan
- 2. Setting policy for how the OWOW Program, outside a plan update process, can receive and include projects
- 3. Setting priorities so that projects competing for funding can be scored / ranked

PROPOSED PRINCIPLES FOR THE CALL FOR PROJECTS FOR INCLUSION IN THE PLAN

All projects that meet threshold of requested information will be included.

Judicious use of the term "required" 02

Project proponents must assert and describe how projects help achieve the OWOVV Plan Update 2018 Goals & Objectives

All project information, once submitted, will be visible to the public on a map and within the database

Other project databases will be input directly to the OWOW database, insofar as is technically feasible



PROCEDURE FOR ACCEPTING PROJECTS

- I. Project submittal tool always open
- 2. OWOW Plan Update 2018 will include projects in database when finalized
- 3. Outside plan update cycle:
 - I. A need to be able to "include" projects
- 4. Curating the project database
 - I. Projects remain up-to-date
 - 2. Proponents receive annual reminders to update



- 3. A system for removing a project no longer tended by a proponent
- 5. The OWOW Plan Update 2018 will include a written section describing this procedure so that others who adopt the Plan are aware, and through their approval, supportive of the procedure.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- ...that the OWOW Steering Committee approve the opening of the OWOW Plan Update 2018 Call for Projects.
- 2. ...that the OWOW Steering Committee approve the proposed procedure for managing the inclusion of projects to the OWOW Plan Update 2018 from a continuously-open call. (agenda packet page 10)



PRINCIPLES FOR RATING & RANKING PROJECTS

Steering Committee responsible for selecting suite of projects for regional grant application

The region benefits from a competitive process

Competition complies first with Prop I Guidelines, second with regional priorities

Built transparently by stakeholders, approved by Steering Committee

STEERING COMMITTEE ACTION IN 2016


- For the most part, language to ensure Prop 1 compliance.
- An important preamble to the approved criteria (emphasis added):
 - IRWM is a collaborative effort to manage all aspects of water resources in a region. IRWM crosses jurisdictional, watershed and political boundaries; involves multiple agencies, stakeholders, individuals and groups; and attempts to address the issues and differing perspectives of all entities involved through mutually beneficial solutions. Our goal is to seek benefits which improve the entire watershed and are not achieved at the expense or detriment of another.


PROP 84 ROUND 4 – OWOW RATING & RANKING

| Benefit Class: | Factor(s): | Points: |
|------------------------------------|---|-----------|
| Benefit to the watershed | Population served, area served | 20 points |
| Water supply | New supply, dry year yield augmentation | 40 points |
| Hydrology & flood control | Flood risk reduction, natural hydrology | 15 points |
| Enhancement of natural environment | Functional habitat value, invasive plant species, rec or open space | 10 points |
| Pollution management | Nonpoint source, contaminant & salt removal, GHG | 25 points |
| Cost efficiency | Ration grant dollars to benefits | 10 points |
| Disadvantaged Community benefit | (presence / absence) | 5 points |






Why a sustainability assessment?





Where we're headed: Selection of Indicators


Indicators will be:
