## SAWPA Prop 1 IRWM, Round 1 – Call for Projects



- Grant Program: Proposition 1, IRWM, Round 1
- Funds Available: Approximately \$2.2 million grant for watershed wide projects
- \$500,000 grant sought under Small Budget Category

- January 22, 2019 Application Submitted to SAWPA
- Feb. 21, Mar. 13, April 3, 2019 SAWPA Rating and Ranking Workshops
- May 23, 2019 Recommended List of Projects to OWOW Steering Committee
- June 4, 2019 Recommended List of Projects to SAWPA Commission ratification
- Late June 2019 DWR Pre-Application Workshop
- Sept 2019 DWR Application Due


## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Develop an Urban Landscape Assessment Tool to measure, classify, monitor, and report on landscape water demands for the Santa Ana River Watershed.
- Provide uniform methodology to accurately calculate landscape water demands at both a regional and agency scale.
- Enable agencies to develop state efficiency targets.
- Establish baseline for more sophisticated tools to assist agencies in tracking development patterns, improve water demand scenario planning, and inform demand management program investments.







#### PROJECT BENEFITS



- 1. Assist over 70 retail agencies in complying with State regulations that require water agencies to adhere to agency-wide water budgets (per Senate Bill 606 and Assembly Bill 1668).
- 2. Support water resource planning and supply/demand forecasts.
- 3. Implement budget-based rates (also known as conservation-based rates).
- 4. Assist water agency customers and responding to billing inquiries.
- 5. Implement water use efficiency programs, like targeted campaigns, in order to determine inefficient water users.
- 6. Provide a resource to field staff who perform water audits.
- Support additional use of aerial information for habitat restoration efforts along Santa Ana River

#### **GRANT APPLICATION**



- Priority Funding Category: Employ New or Innovative Technology or Practices
- Project Type/Benefits: Decision Support Tool / Water Conservation
- SAWPA working collaboratively with member agencies and MWDOC through PA 22 Committee
- Grant Request: \$500,000
- Grant Match: \$705,400 from SAWPA member agencies and MWDOC, possibly Bureau of Reclamation
- Application supported by SAWPA Commission on Jan. 15, 2019

## **Bureau of Reclamation Grant Opportunity**

- Water Management Options Pilots
- Support to completed Basin Studies (i.e. OWOW Plan)
- \$4 million in FY 2019
- Apply tools and information to address water management challenges
- Pilot technical, science based efforts such as refining models, developing new or additional data, evaluating concepts for water measurement, etc.






## Watershed-Wide Projects



- SAWPA approached other Potential Watershed-wide Projects including SAWPA member agencies and MWDOC as partners:
  - 1. Comprehensive Landscape Program (MWDOC)
  - 2. Accelerated Leak Detection and Meter Testing (EMWD)
- Agencies decided to combine Project 1 & 2 into one watershed wide project with EMWD as lead rather than going through PA 22 Committee
- SAWPA PA 22 Committee submittal remains as separate submittal and ranked preliminarily quite high in small budget category
- If successful, local match would not be needed until DWR agreement signed in late spring or early summer 2020.

#### RECOMMENDATION

- Express support for the "Enhancements to Watershed-wide Water Budget Decision Support Tool" project that is seeking \$500,000 from the DWR Proposition 1 IRWM Round 1 Implementation Grant Program funding to be administered by Project Agreement (PA) 22 Committee, and for seeking and accepting local match by interested agencies for the project; and,
- Approve submittal of a Letter of Interest and subsequent application for a Pilot study grant under the Bureau of Reclamation Water Management Options Pilots to further secure local match.

Project 2: High Visibility Turf Removal and Retrofit








## Note the Following Items

- The funding amounts reflect the latest invoices that have been submitted to SAWPA by February 28, 2019.



- PA 22/Grant Administration: December 2019 (the date that the grant agreement expires)
- SAWPA Implementation: June 2019 (the date the projects implementation are scheduled to end)

#### **Program Objectives**


- Provide comprehensive water meter geocoding (account matching) services
- Classify commercial, industrial and institutional (CII) accounts using North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) coding
- Identify of mixed meter CII accounts as defined in the State's final report entitled, Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life, Implementing Executive Order B-37-16.
- Implement for a minimum of six retail water agencies located within the Santa Ana River Watershed and the EMWD and WMWD service areas within the Upper Santa Margarita Watersheds.
- SAWPA staff and Conservation Advisory
   Workgroup will coordinate with consultant
   through regular meetings.





## Program Highlights

- Miller Spatial selected to implement the Program
- Up to \$300,000 in Prop 84 Grant funding authorized by SAWPA PA 22 Committee
  - Funding allocated on a first come / first serve basis
- Project completion estimated
  - October 31, 2018



## City of Chino

- Rates adopted June 2018
- Tyler Munis Billing Software Issues
  - Software also used by Chino Hills
  - Once issue is resolved, they will roll out structure to their customers
- Billing software: In Chino's case, not an issue of **funding** but of the **time** needed to resolve all glitches



## City of Hemet

- Rates study draft complete
- Experienced delays on finalizing study due to development of other major priorities:
  - Well refurbishment
  - New customer meter installation
- Recently city management leadership has changed
- Staff from the public works department are working with the new management to finalize the schedule for bringing the rate structure to the City Council
