# **Activity 18:** Technical Assistance for Community Need

- Objective: Technical Assistance (TA) funding to support the development of projects and programs that address the needs of disadvantaged and underrepresented communities.
- Requires evaluation of projects, plans, and programs following set of evaluation criteria developed by DCI Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)
- Allocated Funding \$2.9 M

### Technical Assistance Criteria


- 1. Serve members of disadvantaged or underrepresented communities
- 2. Address a need or utilize a strength identified in the Community Water Ethnography Report
- 3. Include a project sponsor that demonstrates engagement and readiness to receive the support and assistance
- 4. Meet at least one of the objectives outlined in Section 3 of the 2018 OWOW Plan Update
- 5. Provide detailed project information
  - Project location, schedule, scope, list of deliverables, grant amount requested
- 6. Achieve measurable improvements in the technical, managerial, or financial capacity of the project sponsor

- Criteria also outlines the following:
  - Project Submissions Process
  - Limits of TA Project Funding
  - Project Ranking and Selection Process
  - Feedback and Approval Process
  - DCI Program TA Criteria has been reviewed and approved by DWR
  - Application Due Dates:

    - December 6, 2019 (if necessary)











## Prop 1 IRWM Requirements

#### • All overall project proposals must:

- Respond to climate change, and
- Contribute to regional water self-reliance.
- All individual projects must:
  - Address the most critical needs of the IRWM region,
  - Be consistent with Statewide Priorities,
  - Have an expected useful life, and
  - Have CEQA/permits acquired within 12 months of final grant award.

## Project Updates

- SAWPA met with DWR and OC IRWM representative on October 2.
- DWR final feedback was projects must include construction/implementation component.

OC Smartscape

Raitt & Myrtle Park

- Orange County Coastkeeper decided to withdraw from Prop 1 application; not enough time or funding in order to develop construction/implementation component.
- City of Santa Ana removed recreational portions of the project from the scope due to DWR feedback.

Note: Both changes result in carryover of \$989,072 to Orange County IRWM in Prop 1 Round 2.

## Next Steps

- DWR to make final award announcements mid-2020.
- SAWPA-DWR grant agreement and SAWPA agreements with project proponents to be developed in 2020.
