1. Call to Order & Introductions

The MSAR TMDL/Regional Water Quality Monitoring Task Force Meeting was called to order at 9:01 a.m. by Rick Whetsel at SAWPA. Brief introductions were made by the attendees.

2. Approval of the Meeting Notes

Rick Whetsel asked for any comments on the May 29, 2019 MSAR TMDL meeting notes. There were no comments and the meeting notes were deemed acceptable.

3. Presentation: Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria Monitoring Program (CDM Smith)

Update: Monitoring Program

Steve Wolosoff /CDM Smith presented to stakeholders an update on the 2020 Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria Monitoring Program.

In his presentation, Steve noted that the 2019 Dry Season Monitoring is complete, and that the team is now working on the cool/wet season monitoring.

Mr. Wolosoff reviewed the revisions to the Monitoring Plan and QAPP. It is required to address the new statewide provisions relating to bacteria made in June 2019, as well as a number of follow-on recommendations provided by Regional Board that were also addressed in the Monitoring Plan and QAPP made in August 2019.

<u>Discussion: Regional Board Comments regarding Revised Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria</u> <u>Monitoring Plan & QAPP</u>

Following the review of the revisions made to the Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria Monitoring Plan and QAPP, Mr. Wolosoff presented several suggested recommendations from the Regional Board to stakeholders for further discussion. These suggestions included:

- An assessment is needed for the Priority 3 sites to determine whether they are on track for delisting or justifying an increase in sampling frequency
- Source evaluation plans are needed, pursuant to Resolution No. R8-2012-0001, where water quality monitoring data indicate significant non-compliance with the applicable pathogen indicator objective
- August 2019 MP extends monitoring Priority 3 waters through 2020 dry season, followed by assessment in 2020-21 to propose a course of action in each waterbody
 - – Delisting, source evaluation, UAA, others
- Future monitoring of cyanobacteria/cyanotoxins to guide all aspects of protecting REC 1 use. REC 2 use would also have to be taken into account as would impacts to domestic pets (i.e., dogs)
- For REC 1 bacteria objectives consider the development of region-specific reference/natural sources exclusion policy, development of a limited REC 1 use and/or development of UAAs to remove REC 1 for certain waters

Follow-on actions resulting from this discussion will include:

- Further discussion between Orange County and Regional Board staff regarding the removal of monitoring sites to reduce redundancy with the core program.
- Reaching out to the USFS regarding current on-going monitoring of Forest Service lands to support the Regional Bacteria Monitoring Program.
- Reaching out to the IEWK regarding the sharing of water quality data.
- Regional Board staff will update and reissue their draft letter regarding revisions to and approval of the Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria Monitoring Program Monitoring Plan and QAPP.

4. Action Item: Second one-year option to extend CDM Smith agreement (SAWPA)

Rick Whetsel /SAWPA presented to stakeholders a recommendation for approving a second one-year option to extend CDM Smith Agreement to implement the Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria Monitoring Program. Following brief discussion the three counties unanimously approved the recommendation to approve the second one-year option to extend the CDM Smith agreement.

5. RWQ Task Force Administration (SAWPA)

Future Item: Draft FY 2020-21 Budget

Rick Whetsel /SAWPA informed stakeholders that staff will prepare a draft FY 2020-21 Regional Water Quality Monitoring Task Force budget for stakeholders by November to address the needs of the San Bernardino County MS4 program.

6. Presentation/Discussion: Synoptic Watershed Study (Richard Meyerhoff/GEI Consultants, Steve Wolosoff/CDM Smith and Menu Leddy/EEES)

Richard Meyerhoff/GEI Consultants provided a presentation to stakeholders to update them on the status of the Synoptic Watershed Study.

Steve Wolosoff /CDM Smith presented to stakeholders on the preliminary results of the water quality data.

Menu Leddy /Essential Environmental & Engineering Systems followed with a discussion of the preliminary E. coli / bacteroides results.
