## PFAS Investigations in Corona/Temescal Creek Area Overseen by the Santa Ana Water Board Staff

In 2020, Santa Ana Regional Water Control Board staff requested three regulated facilities in Temescal Creek/Corona area to conduct PFAS investigations. These facilities are 3M Roofing Granule Plant (Brine Ponds), Corona Landfill, and All American Asphalt. The investigations were completed in 2020. Below is a brief summary of the sampling and analysis of PFAS at three facilities.

- 1. 3M Roofing Granule Plant The discharger completed PFAS monitoring on September 24, 2020 and submitted a report on Nov 6, 2020. Workplan and data report have been uploaded to GeoTracker. Attached is a copy of the report.
- Corona Landfill Riverside County Department of Waste Resources completed PFAS monitoring events on April 15 and 16, 2020, and May 27 & 28, 2020 and submitted a report on August 4, 2020. The workplan and data report have been uploaded to GeoTracker. Attached is a copy of the report.
- 3. All American Asphalt Discharger collected three samples on July 29, 2020 from the dewatering pit pond, supply well and Temescal Pond. One sample (pit pond) was analyzed for PFAS. A copy of the lab report is attached.
