Wells 201, 202, & 203 Phase 1B Conveyance Pipelines




Wells 201, 202, 203, & 205 Equipping

The target of 640 acres of Arundo Donax removed and under treatment has been reached. Additional removal is now underway.





 - ▶ Site Preparation: Start Winter 2022
 - Seed Collection and Plant Propagation Ongoing
 - Construction: Winter 2022 Fall 2023
 - ► Start Monitoring and Adaptive Management: Summer 2022
 - Phase 2: Lower Hole and Old Ranch Creeks
 - ▶ 30% Designs
 - ► Construction: Fall 2022 Fall 2023
 - ► Start Monitoring and Adaptive Management: Fall 2023

Water Use Efficiency Budget Assistance Task

Purpose of Task

- Help up to 10 retail agency partners comply with State regulations* that require water agencies to adhere to agency-wide water use efficiency budgets;
 - Side benefit: Provides retail agencies with mapping data to target their existing water use efficiency programs to inefficient water users.
- OCWD/MWDOC the lead for retail partners in North Orange County.

Agency Who Has Signed MOU	MOU Signature Date	Status Updates	
Chino Hills	Nov 2, 2021	City staff is providing SAWPA consultant with their recycled customer data soon for their city-maintained properties.	
Hemet	Aug 19, 2021	SAWPA consultant waiting on a full-year of consumption data, once received they will then prioritize Hemet's customers for analysis.	
Monte Vista Water District	June 29, 2021	SAWPA consultant is currently grouping meters into individual customers.	
Perris	Aug 9, 2021	City staff to provide billing dataset to SAWPA consultant for their 55 dedicated landscape meters.	
Riverside Public Utilities	June 29, 2021	Consultant prioritized customers based on high consumption use. NV5 currently calculating meter service areas for high consumption customers.	
San Bernardino Municipal Water Dept.	Nov 10, 2021	Had kick-off meeting with SBMWD staff. City staff has provided GIS data to SAWPA consultant but is still compiling water usage data.	

Update with OC Partners

- ► The cities of Brea, Fountain Valley and Newport Beach, Orange, and Seal Beach have signed project agreements with MWDOC,
 - These five cities will all likely be included in Project as their amount of dedicated irrigation meters can be covered by SARCCUP grant/match funding,
- ► Each city has had, or is planning, kick off meetings with MWDOC and their consultant,
- ▶ Brea's analysis has started, and Fountain Valley's analysis is underway soon.




Background on Grant

- ▶ Department of Water Resources adopted grant agreement amendment No. 2 with SAWPA on May 29, 2020.
 - ► PA 23 Committee adopted grant amounts (as shown on next slides) at the April 2 and October 1, 2019 Committee meetings, which were incorporated into the amendment with DWR.
- Amounts shown in this presentation reflect invoices submitted through September 30, 2021(latest invoices received at time of publishing this agenda packet).
- As of September 30, 2021, the amount of grant invoiced is 51% of the total \$55M grant.


