PFAS LEGISLATION: AB 2771 & AB 1817

- AB 2771 – Signed by Governor Newsom September 29, 2022
 - Beginning on January 1, 2025, all persons and entities are prohibited from selling, delivering, holding, or offering for sale, any cosmetic product that contains intentionally added PFAS
- AB 1817 – Signed by Governor Newsome September 29, 2022
 - Beginning on January 1, 2025, shall distribute, sale, or offer for sale, any new, not previously used, textile articles containing PFAS, except for outdoor apparel designed for extreme wet conditions (i.e., PPE).

DRINKING & CLEAN WATER SRF – SUPPLEMENTAL INTENDED USE PLAN FY 2022-23

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law – Emerging Contaminants Funding
 - \$66,649,000 CA Drinking Water SRF
 - \$ 6,687,000 CA Clean Water SRF
 - State Board will transfer Clean Water SRF to Drinking Water SRF
 - EC Supplemental Funds = \$73,336,000 for Drinking Water
- Maximum Grant amounts of \$5,000,000

PROPOSED DESIGNATION OF PERFLUOROOCTANOIC ACID (PFOA) AND PERFLUOROOCTANESULFO NIC ACID (PFOS) AS CERCLA HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

Rule Summary:

- EPA is proposing to designate two per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) -- perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS), including their salts and structural isomers -- as hazardous substances under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), also known as Superfund.
- Public comments due before November 7, 2022

- August 16, 2022
 - DDW presented proposed notification level and response level to State Water Board
 - 2 ng/L – Notification Level
 - 20 ng/L – Response Level
