

SARCCUP Project Update Locations



Amendment Changes

- Scope for WMWD/SBVMWD
- Minor budget changes associated with WMWD/SBVMWD
 - ► Both WMWD and SBVMWD moved a combined \$817,000 from Land Purchase to Construction. Land purchase costs and easement fees were less than initially anticipated.
- ► No changes to schedule or benefits



Sterling Pump Station, Riverside-Arlington Basin Facilities, Elsinore Basin Wells, and Interconnections

SARCCUP WMWD Facilities





Sterling Pump Station and La Sierra Pipeline

Completed in 2022

~\$40 million

Benefits:

 Connection between Chino Desalter II to Arlington Desalter System to Mills Gravity Line

Allows movement of extracted SARCCUP supplies to move to JCSD, Norco, Corona, Western retail, Temescal Valley, and Elsinore Valley





Interconnections


- Magnolia Intertie design and construction award complete
- Construction Kickoff July 2023
- Connection between Riverside Public Utilities and Western
- (Cannon and MARB Interconnections see next slide)
- Allows movement of extracted SARCCUP supplies from various groundwater basins

Riverside Basin Well

- Well drilling and casing installation complete
- Pumping development, testing and sampling underway
- Allows movement of extracted SARCCUP supplies from San Bernardino Basin Area, Riverside, and Riverside-Arlington groundwater basins


Elsinore Basin Wells

- New extraction wells with PFAS treatment
- Projects under construction
- Allows movement of extracted SARCCUP supplies from Elsinore groundwater basins



March Air Reserve Basin (MARB) Interconnection

Amendment change



Cannon Interconnection:

- Received bids ~30% over the Engineer's Estimate
- Conducted extensive cost benefit analysis
- No longer provide the expected cost effectiveness

MARB Interconnection:

- Participating groundwater basins remain the same
- Conjunctive use benefits unchanged
- Utilizes Western's Cannon Interconnection construction costs towards the MARB Interconnection with a partnering SARCCUP agency
- Project is under construction and has an expedited construction completion of late 2023
- Positive DWR feedback






Santa Ana Sucker Habitat

Benefits:

- 2.8 miles of stream habitat (red)
- 60 acres riparian habitat surrounding the streams (green)





Recent Accomplishments:


- Funded County Rangers and Operator
 - "Drill and kill" training provided Spring 2023
 - Nonnative plant management and encampment cleanup
 - Anticipated start: Spring/Summer 2023

Permitting/Permissions Pending:

- Encroachment Permit Riverside County Flood Control District
- Right of Entry (ROE) California Department of Fish & Wildlife
- ROE County of Riverside
- ROE City of Riverside
- Grading permits
 - Earthwork anticipated in Fall 2023 (after bird nesting season)

Amendment Scope Change

- Construction/Design Task: Planning and construction will be done related to water diversion, excavation, and rock habitat placement at Hidden Valley Creek and Anza Drain.
- Recent permits acquired allow for this additional work.
- No decrease in benefits.



Water Use Efficiency Budget Assistance Task

Purpose of Task

High-level Scope of work from grant agreement:

- SAWPA will work with **up to ten retail water agencies** in the watershed to create efficiency-based water budgets.
- ► Efficiency budgets will provide **1,200 acre-feet** over a three-year period (i.e. 400 AFY).

How task is implemented:

- ► SAWPA and consultant, NV5, are working with eight upper watershed retail water agencies.
- ► Municipal Water District of Orange County is working with 7+ retail water agencies in northern OC.

Background on Grant Agreement

- Department of Water Resources adopted grant agreement amendment No.
 2 with SAWPA on May 29, 2020.
 - ► PA 23 Committee adopted grant amounts (as shown on next slides) at the April and October 2019 Committee meetings, which were incorporated into that amendment with DWR.
- Dollar amounts shown in this presentation reflect invoices submitted through March 31, 2023 (i.e. the latest invoices received at time of publishing this agenda packet).




