5. COMMITTEE DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

A. INLAND EMPIRE BRINE LINE MASTER PLAN (PA24#2023.16)

David Ruhl provided a presentation titled Inland Empire Brine Line Master Plan (Master Plan), contained in the agenda packet on pages 45-57. The Master Plan is a long-term planning document that addresses the facility needs over a defined planning period. The purpose of the Master Plan is to determine how best to manage and implement the growth and expansion of the Brine Line to best serve the watershed, member agencies, and current and future dischargers. Mr. Ruhl provided a brief description of each of the six (6) categories within the Master Plan scope of work; 1) Update and Calibrate the existing hydraulic model, 2) Market analysis, member agency and stakeholder coordination, and future growth projections, 3) Existing and future Brine Line system evaluation 4) Capacity Management and long-term planning efforts, 5) Multi-use benefits for the future, and 6) Policy considerations.

As part of the calibration process, flow monitoring was performed throughout the Brine Line system over a two-week period. Flow meters were installed at six strategic locations. Flow meter data was collected in 5-minute intervals throughout the monitoring period. Concurrent flow data was collected for each Brine Line discharger. Each discharger's flow was incorporated into the model at their specific discharge location, including the flows from the six flow monitoring locations.

Member Agency and Stakeholder meetings were conducted over a six-month period from February through August 2023. Information was obtained on the Brine Management needs of each agency including groundwater desalination, wastewater (recycled water) desalination and industries that use large volumes of water and have a high salinity discharge.

The policy considerations are to address questions that may necessitate the need to update or initiate new policy considerations such as lateral ownership, capacity buy-back program and how to pay for laterals, projects, and system expansion. Policy considerations will be developed by staff and the General Managers and presented to PA 24 for consideration and review. A draft report of the Master Plan is anticipated to be completed February 2024 and a thorough review will be performed by the member agencies and stakeholders and will be presented to the PA 24 Committee in March 2024 timeframe.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Project Agreement 24 Committee Authorize the General Manager to accept the Grant of Deed from Penske Truck Leasing C. L.P. and record the Grant of Deed at the Riverside County Recorder's Office.

DISCUSSION

In September of 2021, Penske Truck Leasing performed construction on their property on 100 Radio Road, Corona CA. This construction included grading and a block wall near SAWPA Maintenance Access Structure (MAS) 4B-0590. This prompted SAWPA staff to pursue an easement given that excess right-of-way was vacated by the City of Corona in May 2021.

SAWPA Staff worked to provide Penske Truck leasing with a Grant of Easement and surveyed description. Penske Truck Leasing has agreed to the Grant of Exclusive Easement.

RESOURCE IMPACTS

Funds to cover staff time to perform inspections of the Radio Road Easement are included in the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget, Fund 240.

GRANT OF EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT FOR PIPELINE AND RELATED PURPOSES

FOR VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, Penske Truck Leasing Co. 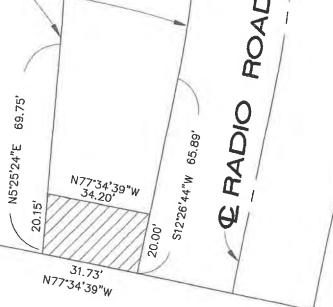

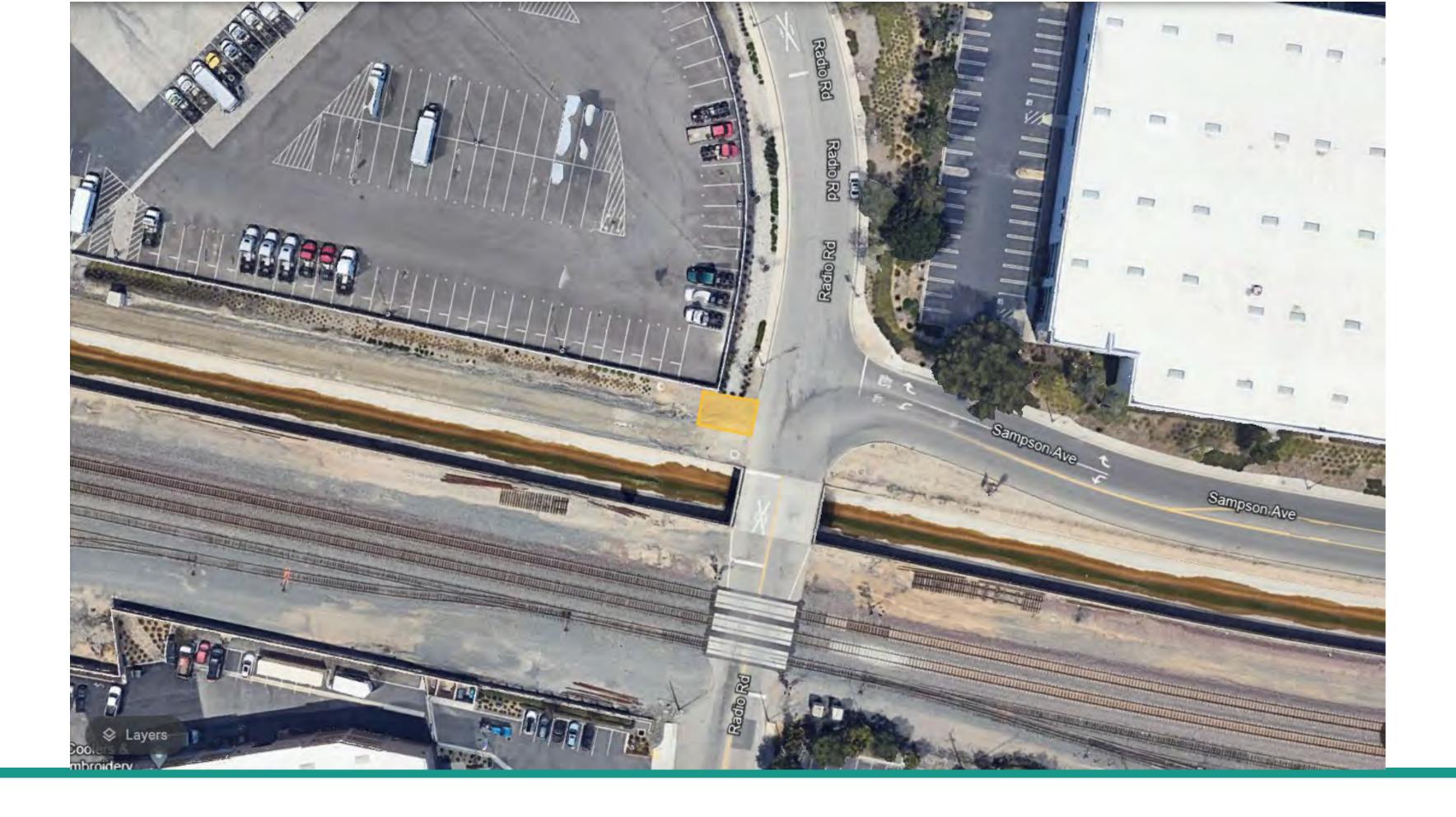
Context

RECOMMENDATION

That the Project Agreement 24 Committee adopt Resolution No. 2024-3 Establishing the Purchase Price for Treatment and Disposal Capacity Rights in the Inland Empire Brine Line.

DISCUSSION

Treatment and Disposal Capacity Right is purchased from Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) when there is a need to purchase additional capacity. OC San sells capacity right in one (1) million gallons per day (MGD) increments. SAWPA establishes the price for Member Agencies to purchase Treatment and Disposal Capacity right through resolution.

The PA 24 Committee periodically adopts updated resolutions on the price to purchase new treatment and disposal capacity right. Since this purchase price is used by SAWPA and Member Agencies for planning projects with a brine discharge staff has proposed an updated resolution for the PA 24 Committee to adopt, so that those terms are current.

The current purchase price for treatment and disposal capacity is established by Resolution No. 2019-8, which was approved in October 2019. New information provided by OC San indicates the OC San sales price has changed. Resolution No. 2024-3 reflects the revised OC San sales price.

RESOURCE IMPACTS

OC San Future Treatment and Disposal Capacity Reserve (R-05) includes funds to purchase capacity from OC San. When capacity purchases are requested by member agencies, member agency funds are deposited in this reserve to cover the OC San purchase price.

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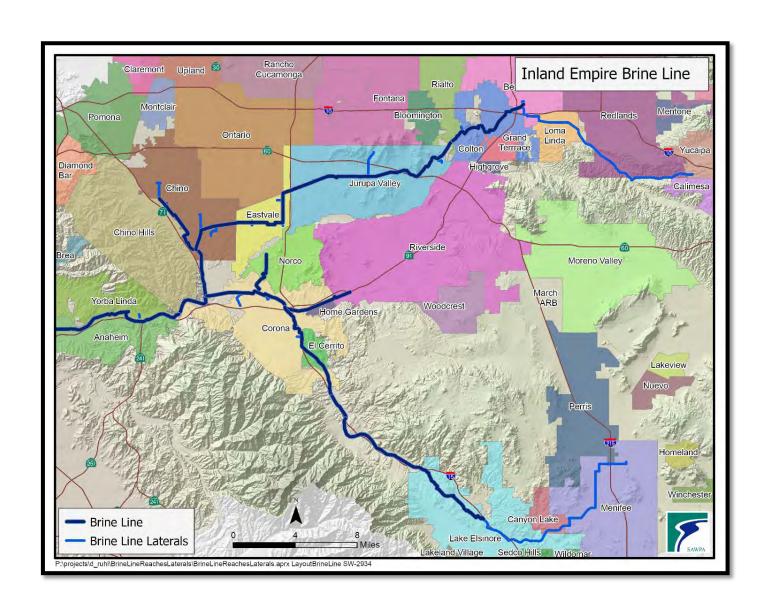

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-3

A RESOLUTION OF THE SANTA ANA WATERSHED PROJECT AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING THE PURCHASE PRICE FOR TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL RIGHTS IN THE INLAND EMPIRE BRINE LINE

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority (hereinafter "SAWPA") has constructed the Inland Empire Brine Line (Brine Line) formerly known as the Santa Ana Regional Interceptor System, intended for the treatment and disposal of non-reclaimable wastewater;

WHEREAS, the best and highest use of the Brine Line is the export of salt with the ultimate goal of achieving watershed "salt balance" and requires maximum utilization of the Brine Line;

WHEREAS, for the long-term operation and maintenance of the Brine Line, it is necessary to collect charges from SAWPA's Member Agencies for the treatment and disposal of highly saline wastewater, including charges for the discharge of suspended solids ("TSS") and biochemical oxygen demand ("BOD");

WHEREAS, one of SAWPA's goals is to fund the long-term maintenance, operations and replacement of the Brine Line to ensure the long-term reliability of the Brine Line;

WHEREAS, the Project Agreement 24 Committee of the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority, created by Project Agreement 24 entered into as of July 17, 2019, was established for the purpose of establishing policy and providing oversight to the Brine Line operations, maintenance, planning, administration, implementation, and improvement of the Brine Line, including but not limited to rate-setting and revenue collection, permit issuance and enforcement, and usage of the Brine Line Enterprise Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Project Agreement 24 Committee of the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority establishes rates and charges for the purchase of treatment and disposal capacity rights for non-reclaimable wastewater that are effective when approved by a majority of the SAWPA Commissioners representing members of the Project Agreement 24 Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Project Agreement 24 Committee of the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority (PA 24 Committee) hereby establishes the following rates and charges, effective immediately, for the purchase of treatment and disposal rights for non-reclaimable wastewater:

- 1. The purchase price shall be Orange County Sanitation District's (OC San) sales price charged to SAWPA for such treatment and disposal rights including OC San's contract cost and SAWPA's administrative costs. The purchase price may change from time-to-time as determined by OC San. By way of example, the purchase price as of the date of this Resolution is as follows:
 - a. \$7,407,683 per MGD, for wastewater strength not exceeding 288 mg/l of BOD and 290 mg/l of TSS on an average basis.
 - b. If the wastewater is or will be at a higher strength as determined by SAWPA, added BOD and TSS capacity also shall be purchased at the rate of

\$1,577.98 per pound of BOD for discharges over the strength level of 288 mg/l, and \$1,145.15 per pound of TSS for discharges over the strength level of 290 mg/l and shall be purchased as part of the initial purchase price.

- 2. The prices set forth in Section 1 above are subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The price shall automatically increase as prices and rates are increased by OC San, and the price charged by SAWPA to its member agencies for the purchase of such OC San treatment and disposal rights shall be no less than the prices charged to SAWPA by OC San notwithstanding the prices set forth in this Resolution;
 - b. OC San treatment and disposal rights shall be sold on a "first-come-first-serve" basis consistent with SAWPA's Transfer Policy as set forth in Resolution No. 308 and any successors thereto;
 - c. Each purchase contract for OC San treatment and disposal rights shall include a provision that a purchaser only may sell unused treatment and disposal rights to SAWPA at a price not-to-exceed the then current price for such rights or the price originally paid for such treatment and disposal rights by the purchaser, whichever is lower. However, SAWPA shall not be obligated to purchase such unused treatment and disposal rights. Further, there shall be no refund or repurchase by SAWPA for unused or unnecessary high-strength wastewater capacity previously purchased by a Member Agency.
- 3. <u>Supersession</u>: All previous Resolutions adopted by the PA 24 Committee establishing prices for purchasing treatment and disposal rights on the Brine Line are hereby superseded.
- 4. <u>Effective Date</u>: This Resolution No. 2024-3 shall be effective on February 6, 2024, and remain in effect until superseded.

RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

In February of 2023, PA 24 authorized Woodard & Curran (W&C) to perform a condition assessment on a portion of Reach IV-B and Reach IV. These condition assessments were identified as being necessary in a 2021 Criticality Assessment performed by Dudek.

In April 2023, W&C prepared a Field Investigation Plan for Reach IV-B and implemented that plan on June 13th and 14th. The work included manned-entry inspections at three (3) maintenance access structures, cleaning of approximately 2,500 feet of pipe and CCTV of approximately 3,379 feet of pipe. A summary of the findings are as follows:

Condition Assessment Findings:

- Minor to moderate corrosion in pipe throughout inspected areas.
- Minor corrosion at most joints inspected.
- Moderate failure of coated lining in pipe throughout a majority of inspected pipeline.
- Minor loss of coated lining at manned-entry inspection locations.
- The consultant utilizes a condition rating index to provide consistent reporting of corrosion damage. The condition rating index is on a scale of 1 5, with a Level 1 rating indicating little or no damage and Level 5 rating indicating severe damage with imminent failure. Overall, the consultant rated the pipe at condition Levels 2 (minor) and 3 (moderate) throughout the pipe and at the manned-entry locations.

DISCUSSION

The findings conclude that all three manned-entry locations to be in fair condition with minor variability in observable corrosion. The overall pipe condition was found to be consistent with the manned-entry locations with an estimated remaining useful life of 10 to 20 years with the following recommendations:

Near Term: Remove corrosion at the pipe joints and recoat pipe joints with epoxy in 2 to 5 years.

Mid-Term: Reinspect pipe in 5 to 7 years to determine rate of deterioration and refine remaining useful life estimate.

Long-Term: Pipe rehabilitation in the next 10 to 20 years. This recommendation would be further refined and reassessed after mid-term inspection results have been evaluated with an updated remaining useful life. At this point in time, the Long-Term rehabilitation costs are estimated at \$9 million not including Engineering or Construction Management services.

Next Steps

- Receive draft report and distribute to Member Agency staff for review and comment.
- Obtain estimate of costs for near and mid-term recommendations to include in Brine Line Capital Improvement Program.
- Present final draft report to PA 24 Committee.

RESOURCE IMPACTS

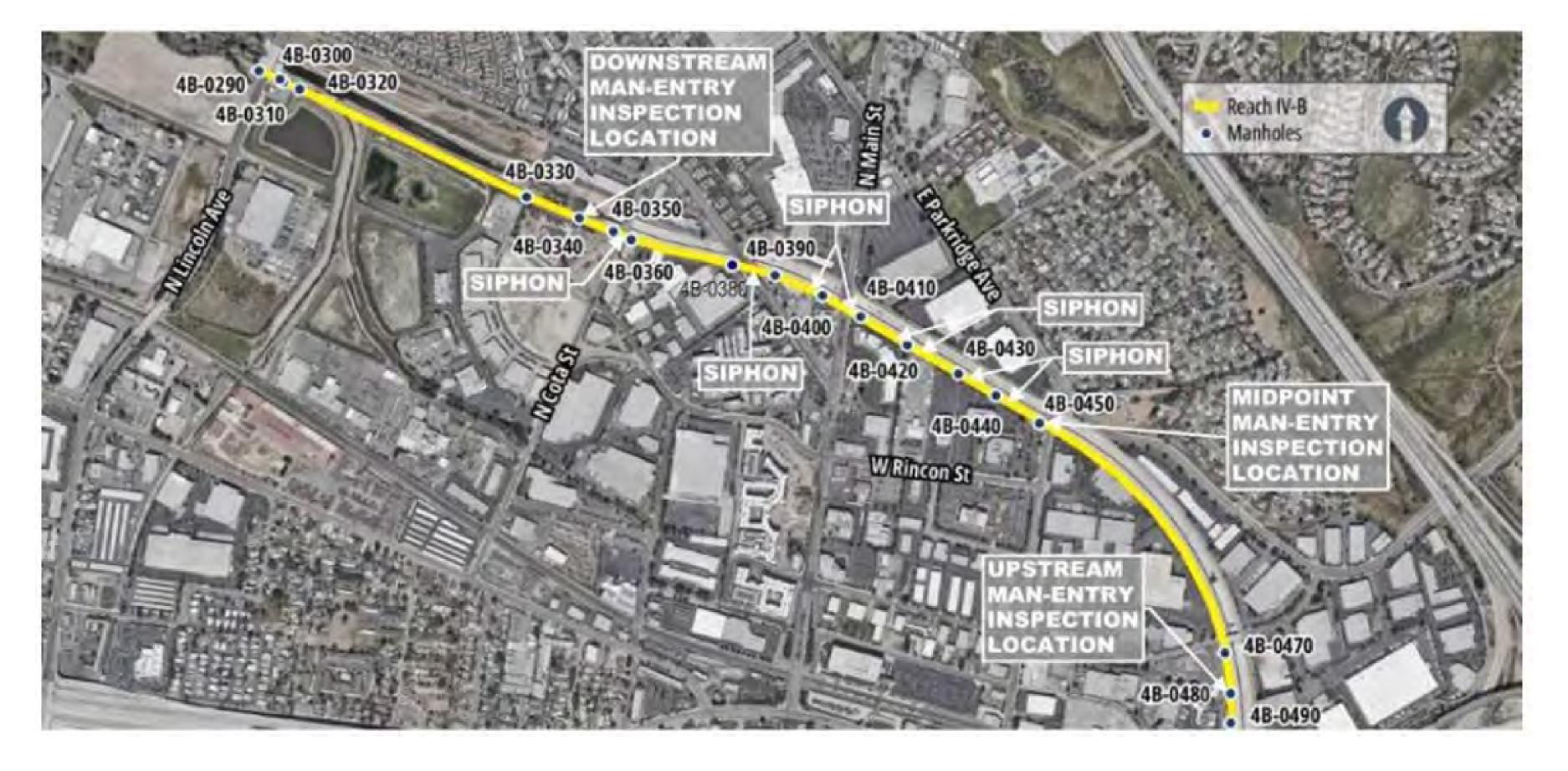

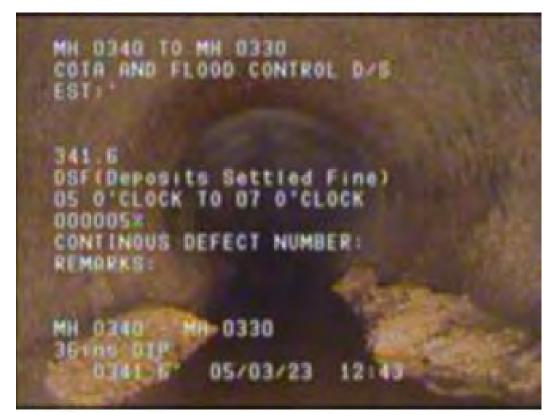

RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

In February of 2023, the PA 24 Committee authorized Woodard & Curran to perform condition assessments on a portion of Reach IV-B and Reach IV. These condition assessments were identified as being necessary in a 2021 Criticality Assessment performed by Dudek.

DISCUSSION

The Reach IV condition assessment field work was originally planned for August of 2023 to coincide with a potential extended shut down of the Eastern Municipal Water District Perris and Menifee Desalters. This shutdown has since been projected to occur in mid-2024. In order to conduct the in-pipe inspections, a flow bypass is necessary. SAWPA staff worked with specialty contractors to develop by-pass plans. Cost estimates to set-up and maintain the by-pass were obtained in the range of \$500,000 to \$750,000. To avoid the high cost of a bypass, the work was postponed in order to coordinate a shut down with the shut down planned for the Reach IV-D Corrosion Rehabilitation Project.

A total coordinated Brine Line shutdown, planned for February 27th- 28th, saves SAWPA substantially on bypass costs and minimizes the impact to Brine Line dischargers. Due to postponing the work, minor costs will be incurred by our consultant due to additional work for completing the condition assessment and reports for both Reach IV-B and Reach IV separately (~\$24,000). Since SAWPA staff and resources will be limited, due to performing line cleaning and CCTV at the same time for the Reach IV-D Corrosion Rehabilitation Project, staff requested Woodard & Curran to provide a cost estimate to perform line cleaning and CCTV on Reach IV (~\$73,000).

A cost proposal provided by Woodard and Curren for the additional work is for a total of \$97,483 and is within the General Manager's expenditure authority.

Reach IV Condition Assessment Draft Report and update to PA 24 Committee is anticipated by Summer 2024.

RESOURCE IMPACTS

Funds to cover the Condition Assessment and field investigations are included in the Fiscal Year 23-24 Budget Fund No. 320-03 (Pipeline Replacement and Capital Investment Reserve) and Fund 240 (Brine Line Enterprise).

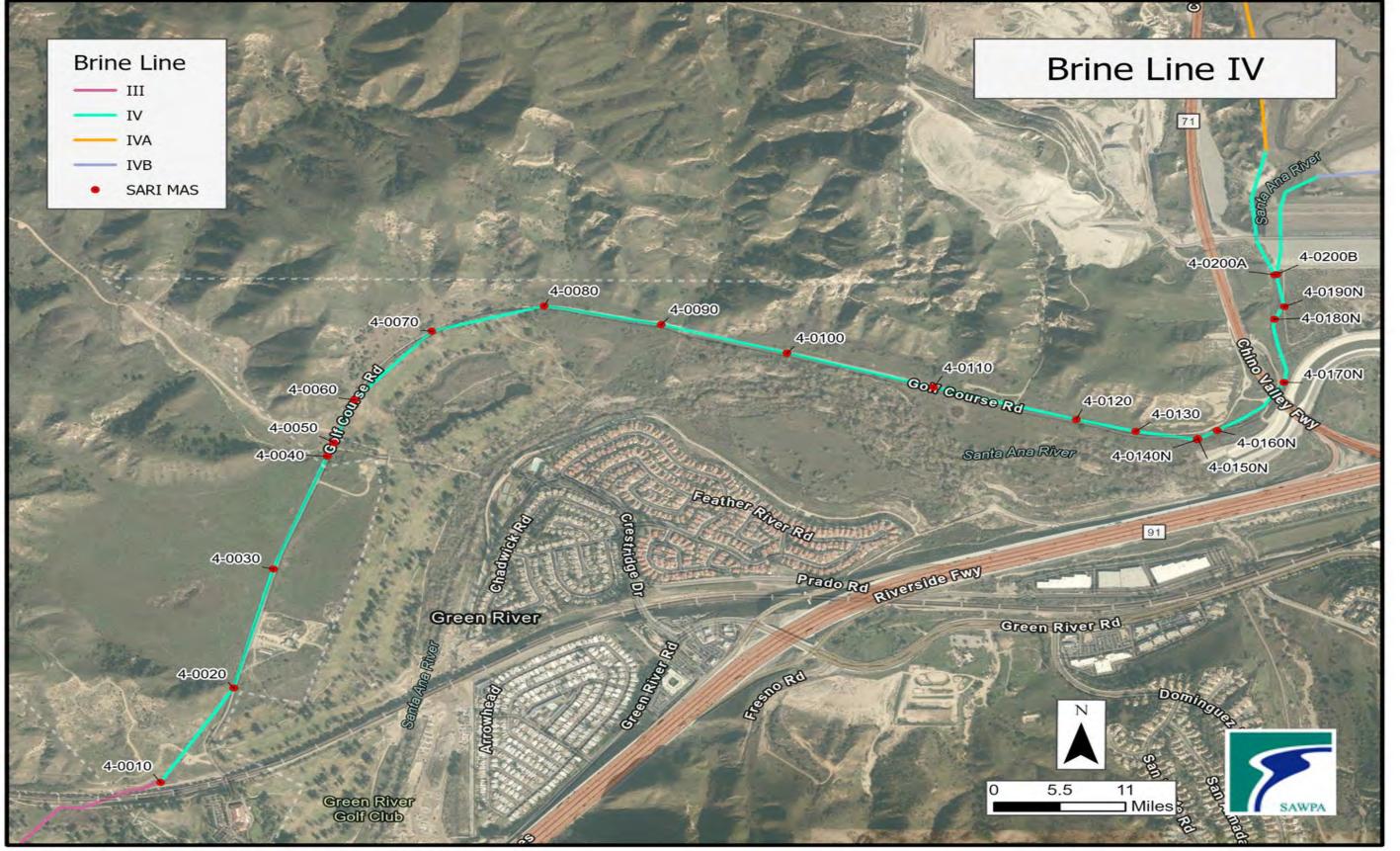

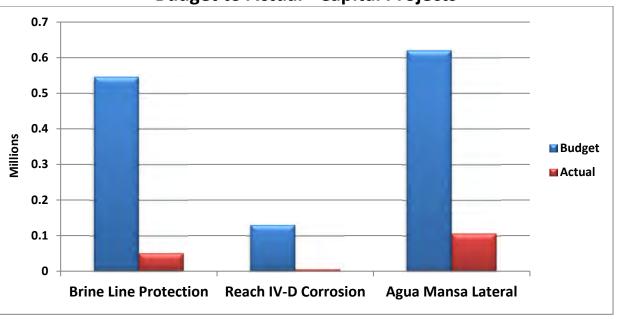

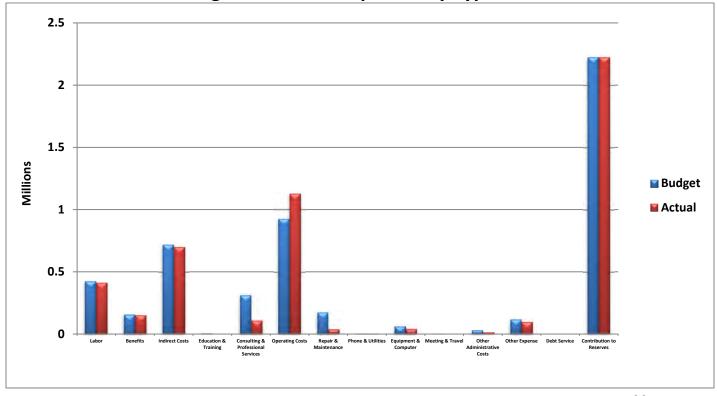
Budget to Actual - Capital Projects

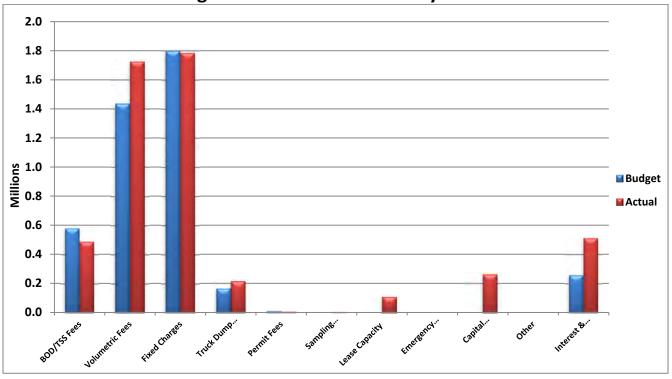

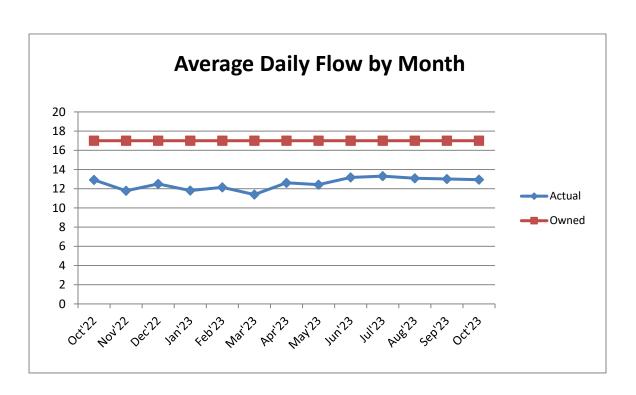

Budget to Actual - Revenues by Source

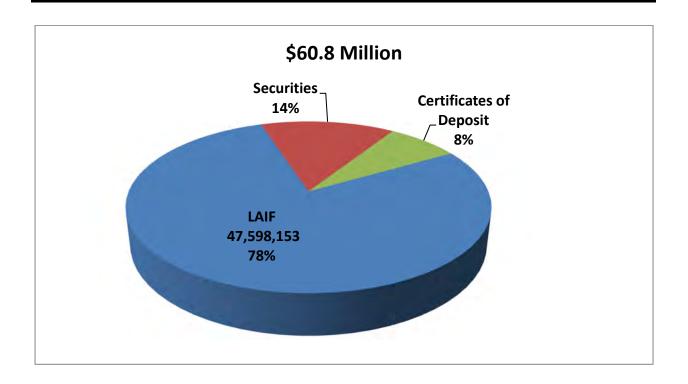

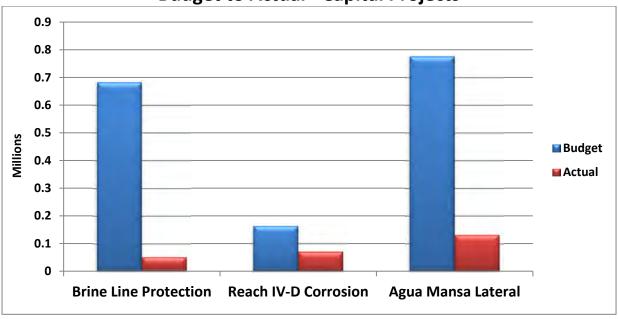

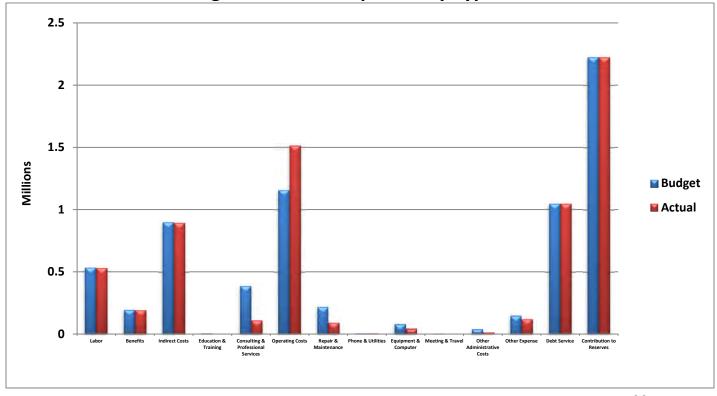
Budget to Actual - Capital Projects

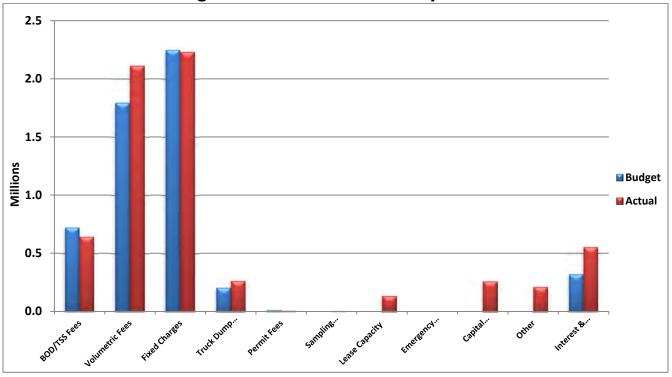

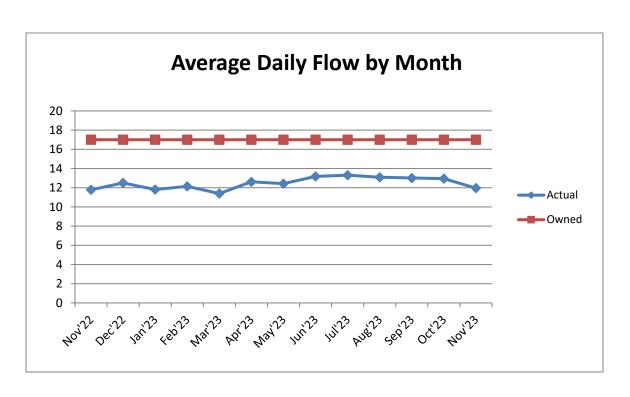

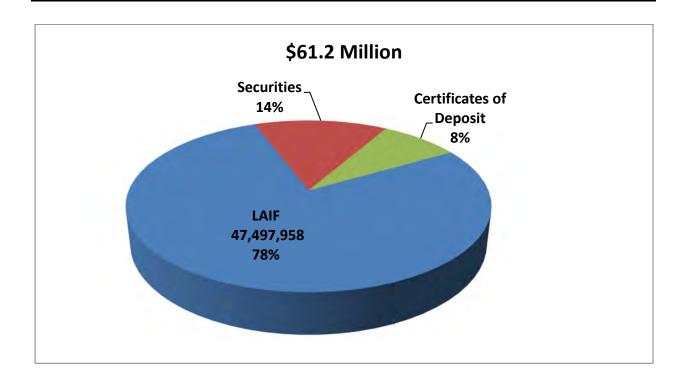
